OBJETIVOS

This course for beginners presents the fundamental aspects of the English language, with content at the A1.1 level of the CEFR. By covering the essential grammar and vocabulary to introduce oneself, greet other people, talk about numbers and make basic sentences in the present simple tense the course gives learners the necessary tools to start using the language straight away. Learners participate in role-play and conversation activities which encourage them to use the language spontaneously and meaningfully. The writing and speaking assignments that follow offer the chance to use the language in a range of situations. The student needs to follow the instructions to create short written and spoken texts which allow them to reuse the new language independently.

CONTENIDOS

Unit 1

Role-play: Numbers quiz

This role-play encourages the learner to practise saying numbers by participating in a quiz.

Conversation class: Greetings & Farewells

This conversation class practises greetings and farewells.

Saying hello and goodbye – Speaking assignment

This assignment encourages the learner to say the words for greetings and farewells.

Numbers – Writing assignment

This assignment provides practice at writing the numbers 1–10.

Unit 2

Role-play: Days and months quiz

This role-play encourages the learner to review the vocabulary of days and months in a short quiz.

Conversation class: Nice to meet you

This conversation class gives the learner the opportunity to practise the language used when meeting another person for the first time.

To be – Speaking assignment

This assignment asks learners to record some answers about themselves using full sentences in affirmative or negative forms.

Days and months – Writing assignment

This assignment practises the correct spelling of days and months.

Unit 3

Role-play: TV game show – Common objects

This role-play encourages the learner to guess the names of some common objects after listening to simple definitions.

Conversation class: Everyday objects

This conversation class provides practice in naming common objects. Students talk with the teacher to identify some household and office objects.

Three Objects – Speaking assignment

This assignment requires learners to submit a short recording where they talk about three objects in their house.

Everyday objects – Writing assignment

This assignment reviews some of the vocabulary presented in this unit.

Unit 4

Role-play: The party – quiz

This role-play reviews the language of introductions and meeting someone for the first time.

Conversation class: Countries and nationalities

This conversation class provides practice using vocabulary related to countries and nationalities. Students talk with the teacher about some images showing different flags.

Profession and Nationality – Speaking assignment

This assignment asks learners to make a short recording about their profession and nationality.

Mediation: Introducing your friends – Writing assignment

This assignment requires learners to submit a short text introducing friends.

Unit 5

Role-play: The party

This role-play provides practice in introducing yourself and meeting someone for the first time. Students will ask and answer the typical questions used to introduce ourselves and get

to know another person.

Conversation class: Getting to know you

This conversation class gives extended practice at asking for and giving more detailed personal information in the 3rd person.

About me – Speaking assignment

This assignment requires learners to submit a short recording using the 1st person Present simple of some common verbs.

This is me! – Writing assignment

This assignment requires learners to write a short text giving personal information such as name, age, profession, nationality or family information.

Unit 6

Role-play: Introductions

This role-play continues the theme of getting to know another person, asking for and giving personal information etc.

Conversation class: I relax in the evening

This conversation class provides practice using prepositions of time. Students talk with the teacher about some images and their own routine.

Daily Routine – Speaking assignment

This assignment asks learners to submit a short recording answering questions about what time they usually do activities in their daily routine.

Days of the Week – Writing assignment

This assignment asks the learner to produce a short text including activities they do on different days of the week.

Unit 7

Role-play: Transport times

This role-play reviews the language used to tell the time.

Conversation class: I usually listen to rock music

This conversation class provides practice using the Present simple to describe routines and preferences. Students exchange questions with the teacher and use the Present simple.

Travel and transport – Speaking assignment

This assignment requires learners to answer some simple questions about the types of transport they use.

My day – Writing assignment

This assignment gives the learner practice at writing the times of day that they do different things.

Unit 8

Role-play: House for sale

This role-play uses the vocabulary needed to talk about houses and flats.

Conversation class: It's her phone

This conversation class provides practice using possessive adjectives. Students talk with the teacher about some images and possessions.

Mediation: Describing a room – Speaking assignment

This assignment requires the learner to submit a short audio recording describing a room using “there is/there are”.

My house – Writing assignment

This assignment requires learners to produce a short text which tests their ability to describe the place where they live and use basic house and home vocabulary.
